

CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS FOR STUDENT AND EMERGING POETS: UNRAVEL

The Union Gallery is hosting a poetry reading event on Friday, September 28, 2018, from 4:30-6pm as part of Culture Days and in conjunction with Kingston WritersFest. The gallery invites student and emerging poets to apply.

Lindsey Wilson's worked up/wound up and Dayna Riemland's no one lives here anymore will be on view at the gallery during the event. Wilson's immersive exhibit includes fibres that will be spun into yarn and turn into balls over the course of the exhibit. This work engages notions of labour and questions the precarious relationship between humans, animals, and plants. Riemland's no one lives here anymore uses the labour of embroidery to explore individual experiences through personal history and memories. The poetry event, therefore, seeks out works that broadly engage with the ideas presented in the exhibitions.

Guidelines for Submissions

Please note: This is a juried event and poets will be notified by <u>Friday, September 22</u> if their application was successful.

All submissions should be sent to ugallery@queensu.ca, with the following attached in the email as a single attachment (.doc/.docx or .pdf are preferred):

- 1. A brief introduction and short bio, outlining any experience with writing/performing poetry (e.g. community involvement, campus clubs participation, local open mic, etc.)
- 2. A sample of 1-3 pages of your own poetry, **preferably the poetry you wish to perform at the event**.
- 3. Any relevant writing experience/publications/literary CV

Submissions are due by Saturday, September 15, 2018, midnight
