The Union Gallery is a student-driven university organization that serves both the Queen's and the Kingston communities. It is a contemporary art gallery that presents visual and interdisciplinary art. It is committed to furthering the role of contemporary art as a platform for critical engagement, creative interpretation, activation, and development. It is a resource for enhanced experiential learning, professional skills development and research opportunities for university students.

The gallery is inviting nominations from student volunteers for committees and other volunteer positions related to gallery management and programming. Committees are formed to work on specific tasks or projects including programming, outreach, fundraising and development, advocacy. Each committee may have a chair and co-chair who will work with gallery staff to fulfil their responsibilities. The term of each position depends on the specific project but most would be up to one year and may be renewable. **Committee members should understand and support the mandate and goals of the gallery.**

Committees:

1. Audience Development and Advocacy
2. Fundraising – Cezanne's Closet Gala and other fundraising and development initiatives
3. Programming and Events – Exhibitions and related programming and other events
4. Ad Hoc committees - These committees are on an 'as-needed' basis as issues arise.
5. Other Volunteer opportunities include: Gallery attendants – Two hour shifts in the gallery each week, engaging with visitors and monitoring exhibitions.
